

## **Introduction**

A journey that takes you to the dunes at Sossusvlei and our coastal area of Swakopmund. Heading north into Damarland and the UNESCO heritage sight of Twyfelfontein with it's wealth of rock engravings before heading into the Etosha National Park. The next days take you along some of Namibia's northern waterways, to the Kavango River and through the BwaBwata National Park (are previously known as the Caprivi Strip) to Botswana and Chobe National Parl. Your journey ends at the world renown Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe.

## Day 1

## Villa Vista Guesthouse, Windhoek



Situated in Central Namibia, the cosmopolitan city of Windhoek serves as the capital of the country. It is home to an international airport and a plethora of restaurants, shops, entertainment venues and accommodation options. The city is clean, safe and well-organised, with a colonial legacy that is reflected in its many German eateries and shops, and the widespread use of the German language. Windhoek has an interesting mix of historical architecture and modern buildings, many of which are worth a look, including the Alte Feste an old fort, the 1896 Christuskirche Christ Church, and the more contemporary Supreme Court.

#### **Day Itinerary**

Route: HKIA to City

Distance: 48 km

Journey: Upon arrival at Windhoek International Airport you will be met and transferred to your guest house for overnight accommodation.

## **Overnight: Villa Vista Guesthouse**

Villa Vista is an upmarket family owned and managed guesthouse situated in a quiet neigbourhood close to the Windhoek city centre. Being well situated makes it a true home hidden in the big city life.All the rooms are individually decorated in a unique style, using wood, glass, candles and natural elements.

# Day 2 Namib Desert Lodge , Solitaire



Situated in the Khomas region of Central Namibia, the desert town of Solitaire serves as an oasis in the Namib Desert. The town provides an important stop on the way to the ancient dunes of Sossusvlei, allowing travellers to stock up on essentials as they make their way further into the wilderness. Solitaire also has a small bar and is renowned for its famous apple pie - said to be the best in the country. Enjoy a scenic sundowner with views of the spectacular Namib desert, hike and bike through the unspoilt natural surroundings, or visit the wonderful local Cheetah Sanctuary.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Windhoek to Namib Naukluft Park

Distance: 310 km

Journey: we leave Windhoek travelling via the gravel roads and the Khomas Hochland mountain range, this area is one of farming communities till we reach the end of the escarpment (crossing the Tropic of Capricorn) where we descend

via the Remhoogte Pass to the settlement of Solitaire. The terrain varies dramatically as we travel to our lodge where arrival is due mid to late afternoon.

## **Overnight: Namib Desert Lodge**

Set below striking fossilised dunes, the comfortable lodge provides a spectacular experience of ancient desert. 65 rooms, two swimming pools and a waterhole are surrounded by sandy splendour. Breathe in the grandeur on a sunset drive and feel the earth underfoot. Relax in the arms of the Namib.

Location: Approximately 60km north of Sesriem on the C19



#### Standard Twin Room

The rooms are situated at the foot of the fossilised dunes overlooking grassy savanah's or the base of the dunes. The rooms have twin beds, en suite bathrooms (showers), air-conditioners and a veranda.

## Day 3

Namib Desert Lodge, Solitaire

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Sesriem – Sossusvlei - Sesriem

Journey: We'll need to be on the move before dawn as we make our way through a dry riverbed and across the gravel plains towards the Namib Dunes. We'll stop at Dune 45 before making our way to Sossusvlei with age old sands said to be around five million years old. Dead Vlei with its white pan and contrasting black scorched trees is also on our visit list. Whilst this region appears to be lifeless there are a variety of animal species that have adapted to these conditions and if we're lucky may see Oryx antelope, ostrich, springbok and don't forget about the birdlife and reptiles that inhabit the area. Return to our lodge for lunch, late afternoon visit to the Sesriem Canyon where the ephemeral Tsauchab River has shaped the area over millions of years.

## Dune 45

Named for its location 45 kilometres past the town of Sesriem, Dune 45 is renowned for its elegant shape, which – along with its position close to the road – have earned it the distinction of 'most photographed dune in the world'. If you're not keen for the strenuous hike to the top of Big Daddy, Dune 45 is a more forgiving alternative, standing at only 80 metres and featuring a much gentler gradient.



## Sossusvlei

Located in the scenic Namib-Naukluft National Park, Sossusvlei is where you will find the iconic red sand dunes of the Namib. The clear blue skies contrast with the giant red dunes, making this one of Africa's most scenic natural wonders and a photographer's heaven. This awe-inspiring destination is possibly Namibia's premier attraction, with its unique dunes rising to almost 400 metres - making them some of the highest in the world. These iconic dunes come alive in morning and evening light and draw photography enthusiasts from around the globe. Sossusvlei is home to various desert wildlife, including oryx, springbok, ostrich and a variety of reptiles. Visitors can climb 'Big Daddy', one of Sossusvlei's tallest dunes; and explore Deadvlei, a white, salt, claypan dotted with ancient trees.



#### Dead Vlei

This ancient clay pan was once an oasis, studded with acacias and fed by a river that suddenly changed course, leaving the earth to dry up along with the trees it previously supported. So dry were the climatic conditions that the trees never decomposed – instead they were entirely leached of moisture so that today, 900 years later, they remain as desiccated, blackened sentinels dotting the pan's cracked surface. Surrounded by the red-pink dunes of the Namibia Desert, they create a surreal spectacle that is a photographer's dream.



#### Sesriem Canyon

Sesriem Canyon is a captivating natural wonder located in the heart of the Namib Desert in Namibia. Carved over millions of years by the Tsauchab River, this narrow gorge is a testament to the power of erosion. The name Sesriem comes from the Afrikaans and Dutch words for six leather straps, which early pioneers used tied together to draw water from the deep pools within the canyon. Sesriem Canyon is not only a geological marvel but also a haven for unique desert flora and fauna, making it a popular stop for tourists exploring the surreal landscapes of the Namib Desert.

# Day 4 Beach Hotel Swakopmund, Swakopmund



Set along Namibia's spectacularly scenic coast, the seaside town of Swakopmund is known for its wide-open avenues, colonial architecture, and its surrounding otherworldly desert terrain. Founded in 1892 as the main harbour for German South-West Africa, Swakopmund is often described as being more German than Germany. Now a seaside resort town, Swakopmund is the capital of the Skeleton Coast tourism area and has plenty to keep visitors happy. The quirky mix of German and Namibian influences, adventure options, laid-back atmosphere and cool sea breeze make it a very popular Namibian destination. Visitors can look forward to a number of exciting activities including: quad biking, horse riding, paragliding, fishing, sightseeing and fascinating desert tours.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Namib Naukluft Park to Swakopmund

Distance: 345 km

Journey: we leave the Sesiem area to the settlement of Solitaire, not far north of this we cross the Tropic of Capricorn. The surrounds of the Gaub and Kuiseb Canyons provide good geological phenomenon, in addition we may see the elusive Mountain Zebra before travelling across the gravel plains of the Namib Desert with its endless horizons, our destination the Atlantic Ocean and coastal town of Swakopmund.


#### **Overnight: Beach Hotel Swakopmund**

## Sandwich Harbour 4x4 Scenic Excursion Half Day

Departing from the Walvis Waterfront, Sandwich Harbour 4x4 Scenic Excursion Half Day travels to Walvis Bay Lagoon to see masses of flamingos and other coastal birds that reside in and around the lagoon at different times of the year. From here, the drive initially takes participants to the Kuiseb River delta, a dry riverbed where the odd springbok, oryx or jackal may be spotted. If weather and tides allow, adventurers will drive to the Sandwich Harbour Lagoon along the beach, one of Southern Africa's unique wetlands and one of five RAMSAR sites (Ramsar site no. 743) in Namibia. There will also be an opportunity for participants to enjoy something to eat at a suitable place to stop, where a selection of oysters and snacks with sparkling wine, beers and cool drinks will be served.

**Day 6 Twyfelfontein Country Lodge, Twyfelfontein** 



Set in the Kunene Region of northwestern Namibia, Twyfelfontein is a spectacularly scenic area, featuring one of the largest and most important concentrations of rock art in Africa. The name 'Twyfelfontein' translates to 'Fountain of Doubt', which refers to the perennial spring situated in the impressive Huab Valley flanked by the slopes of a sandstone

table mountain. It was this spring that attracted Stone Age hunters over six thousand years ago, and it was during this time that the extensive group of rock engravings and paintings were produced. Visitors can look forward to basing themselves at some wonderfully shady campsites along the Aba-Huab riverbed, while exploring over thirty different sacred ritual sites of the traditional hunter-gatherer communities.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Swakopmund to Twyfelfontein

Distance: 385 km

Journey: We travel north along the coastline to Cape Cross Seal Reserve, home to between eighty and one hundred thousand Fur seals, endemic to southern Africa they are commonly known as "eared seals". Leaving the coast behind we cross the plains heading to the old mining town of Uis, our travels will take us past the Brandberg Moutain as we head into Damaraland, an area characterised by its rocky and rugged landscapes of rough, fascinating beauty.

## **Overnight: Twyfelfontein Country Lodge**

Welcome to Twyfelfontein Country Lodge. A true landmark situated in the heart of one of the world's most magnificent wilderness regions. Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Twyfelfontein in Damaraland is home to one of the largest collections of rock-art engravings found in Southern Africa. Not only did the Khoi-San and tribes of ancient years leave us with a true cultural heritage, but the whole area is characterised by natural wonders such as Doros Crater, Burnt Mountain, Organ Pipes, Petrified Forest and desert-adapted animals – of which the desert-adapted elephant is probably the most well-known species.

Nestled along the mountainside, the lodge beautifully blends in with its surrounding environment. Using natural stone, carefully selected paint colours and thatched roofs, its design compliments the sandstone rock formations with minimum visual impact on this picturesque landscape. Magnificent views from the deck over the Huab Valley, desert plains and distant mountains provide for hours of relaxed comfort, peace and tranquillity.

Twyfelfontein is much more than just accommodation; it is a destination in itself.

# Day 7

Okaukuejo Resort, Etosha South



Located just south of the boundary of Etosha National Park in northwestern Namibia, Etosha South makes up the southern region of this wild paradise. The area is comprised of a collection of world class private game reserves. The national park can be accessed via the southern entrance at Andersson's Gate. Visitors can catch a glimpse of a variety of wildlife including: lion, giraffe, elephant, white and black rhino, and a multitude of plains game. Popular activities include: enjoying an open 4x4 safari with an expert guide, half day or full day drives with the option of a picnic lunch with wine on the full day game drive.

#### **Day Itinerary**

Route: Twyfelfontein to Etosha National Park

Distance: 300 km

Journey: This morning we accompany a local guide to view the rock engravings and rock paintings at Twyfelfontein, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Living Museum of the Damara situated nearby allows visitors the opportunity to get to know their traditional culture, this in an attempt to reconstruct the 'lost culture' of the Damara People. By visiting we contribute to the preservation of this culture.

Passing through Khorixas and on to Outjo, a mixture of communal and commercial farming land we arrive at Etosha National Park.

#### Overnight: Okaukuejo Resort

Okaukuejo Resort is located within the Etosha National Park in Namibia. Accommodation options consist of comfortably furnished rooms and chalets with air conditioning, refrigerators, and tea/coffee-making facilities. Chalets have fully equipped kitchens/kitchenettes. Guests can start the day with an inclusive breakfast on-site. Facilities and services include a restaurant, a bar, a swimming pool, a souvenir shop, and an onsite convenience store. Area activities include game drives, birdwatching, and wildlife spotting.

## Day 8

Namutoni Resort, Etosha East



Located in Northwestern Namibia, Etosha East is a protected sanctuary in the eastern part of the world-renowned Etosha National Park, known as one of the most accessible game reserves in Southern Africa. Etosha East boasts vast open plains scattered with semi-arid savannah grasslands dotted with watering holes and secluded bush camps. An impressive 5000-square-kilometre Etosha salt pan makes up a large area of the eastern side of the park and can even be seen from space. This remote area teems with abundant wildlife such as lions, elephants, black rhinos and giraffes, as well as a variety of birdlife featuring flamingos, ostriches, eagles, hornbills, and owls.

#### **Day Itinerary**

Route: Okaukuejo Resort - Namutoni Resort

Distance: Game drive

Journey: today we are flexible depending on your requirements. The day can unfold by heading out at dawn into the Okaukuejo area for a game drive, returning for breakfast before packing the vehicle and heading off towards Namutoni. Alternatively up early, pack vehicle, quick breakfast and head off. Our guide will advise on the best option for the day once there as weather and game viewing opportunities vary day to day.

Lunch will be taken at the most central of the Resorts, Halali, before travelling to Namutoni for overnight.

#### **Overnight: Namutoni Resort**

Namutoni Resort is located in the eastern part of the Etosha National Park. The resort boasts a selection of double rooms, bush chalets, and campsites. Guests can indulge in delicious meals from the on-site restaurant. Other services and facilities include a swimming pool, a bar, a tourist shop, a floodlit waterhole, a filling station, and a kiosk.



## **Activities**

Etosha Pan

#### Etosha Pan

Aeons ago, Etosha Pan was the bed of a vast lake; today what remains is a glittering, silvery-green salt pan that stretches across roughly 5000 square kilometres. Etosha is protected by the Etosha Pan National Park surrounded by savannah plains and woodlands supporting large herds of elephants. When dry, the pan sustains little life except for the algae that gives it its distinctive colour, and migratory birds that use it as a pit stop, but with heavy rain it becomes a shallow lake where flamingos breed, pelicans wade and feed, and a variety of mammal species come to quench their thirst, including leopards, lions, white rhinos, hunting dogs and antelopes.

Day 9 Hakusembe River Lodge , Rundu



Bordering Angola, on the banks of the Okavango River in northern Namibia, the town of Rundu serves as the capital of the eastern Kavango region. Rundu is renowned for its local woodcarvers market and is filled with impressive woodcarvers' workshops. The town provides a great stopover to refuel for visitors heading to Katima Mulilo, enthralling Popa Falls, or Mahangu Game Reserve, home to the endangered wild dog and lion, leopard, elephant, cheetah, and hippo. Visitors to Rundu can also look forward to great game viewing, excellent bird watching as well as kayaking on the spectacular Kavango River.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Namutoni Resort - Rundu

Distance: 430 km

Journey: we leave Etosha National Park behind and start our journey to the north of Namibia, a lodge on the banks of the Kavango River bordering Angola. We pass through the mining town of Tsumeb and active farmlands of Grootfontein to arrive in the Kavango Region.

## **Overnight: Hakusembe River Lodge**

A lush green oasis on the banks of the Okavango River. Absorb river peace from one of the 20 chalets, hop aboard the Hakusembe River Queen, stroll to the cultural village or just relax on the deck listening to the soft symphony of feathered friends.

Location: approximately 16 km west of Rundu on the B 10 (Okavango).

# Day 10 Ndhovu Safari Lodge, Divundu



Set roughly 200 kilometres east of Rundu on the southeastern banks of the great Okavango River, the small village of Divundu is a wonderful destination from which to explore the river, game parks and national reserves of the area. Visitors can enjoy fishing or bird watching boat safaris, or visit the Mahango Game Park, which is home to herds of elephant as well as hippo, buffalo, giraffes, antelope, and many other animals. The spectacular Popa Falls, a dramatic series of cascades - are a popular must-see attraction. Divundu is also the perfect base for adventures in Botswana and the Okavango Delta.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Rundu - Ndhovu Safari Lodge

Distance: 220 km

Journey: A leisurely start today as we have a short drive to make to continue our time on the Kavango River by staying in the area near Popa Falls.

## Overnight: Ndhovu Safari Lodge

Ndhovu Safari Lodge is a peaceful riverine retreat overlooking the well-known Zambezi Game Park (Bwabwata National Park). In true safari tradition, Ndhovu Safari Lodge offers luxury tented accommodation, each tent being fully equipped with its own En-suite bathroom facilities. For the adventurous type, there is a River tent on the water. Here guests can feel real close to crocodiles and hippos, relax in the sun on the deck or try catching the famous tiger fish. In addition, the campsite comprises of 3 camping areas. Facilities offered at the lodge includes sundowner river cruises, fishing excursions, village tours and game drives whilst the birdlife in the area will satisfy the most ardent bird-watcher - over 400 different species have been recorded in the surroundings.

## Kavango

The Kavango region lies in northeastern Namibia and includes the western part of the Caprivi Strip to the northeast. The region is largely separated from Angola by the magnificent Kavango River, which dominates the area and is essential to the local Kavango people's survival. This magnificent river and the surrounding thickly wooded savannah provides a striking contrast with the other more arid areas of Namibia. Bordering the Kavango River is the Mahango Game Reserve. Visitors can look forward to exploring this impressive reserve, featuring riverine forests, broad floodplains, and majestic baobab trees. This pristine natural environment forms an ideal habited for an astonising array of wildlife including large herds of elephant, a number of rare game species, and over four hundred species of bird.



## Popa Falls

Based on the banks of the Okavango River, the Popa Falls is a scenic series of cascades in the village of Divundu, Namibia. This 4-metre high waterfall serves as a picturesque setting for sundowners, boat cruises and dinners. Situated just 15 kilometres from Mahango Game Park, the falls is a ravishing rest stop to the park's astonishingly scenic landscape of perennial rivers, dense woodlands, lush forests, floodplains and reed-lined waterways. The region is teeming with birdlife namely egrets, cranes, herons, pelicans, storks, Pel's Fishing Owl and Montagu's Harrier. Popa Falls Game Park

is the smallest in Namibia, still, it offers spectacular sightings of various animals such as elephant, hippo, buffalo, Nile Crocodile, red lechwe, reedbuck, as well as roan, sable, and sitatunga antelope.

## **Day 11**

## Ndhovu Safari Lodge, Divundu

#### **Day Itinerary**

Day in the area, starting off with a game drive into the Bufallo Game Park and afternoon boat cruise. Time permitting we can also visit Mahango Game Reserve (Bwabwata National Park Mahango core area).

#### **Activities**

The Buffalo Game Park

#### Mahango Game Reserve

A pristine protected area bordering Botswana, Mahango Game Reserve in Namibia provides a convenient stopover between Rundu and Katima Mulilo and forms part of the beautiful Bwabwata National Park. Woodlands, the Kavango River, and vast floodplains of the Okavango River basin known as 'omurambas', dominate the park's landscape, and elephants, lions, leopards and different types of antelope - including red lechwes, sables and roans, - are among the 99 species of animals found here. This park is an excellent destination for avid bird watchers, with its 400-odd species, and provides the perfect location to catch a glimpse of crocodiles and hippos in the Kavango River. Besides guided daytime wildlife safaris, the reserve also offers nighttime game drives.



## The Buffalo Game Park

The Buffalo Game Park, also known by its official name of Buffalo Core Area, is nestled on the eastern side of the Okavango in the Kavango region of Namibia. Sprawling over 600 kilometres, the park is home to an abundance of game, with a large concentration of elephants, buffalos, sable antelope and hippos, calling the area home. A part of the Buffalo park is situated in the ruins of an old South African army station, which is regularly visited by impalas and kudus.

Day 12 Namushasha River Lodge , Kwando River



Meandering through the spectacular Caprivi Strip in northwest Namibia, the Kwando River rises from the central Angolan highlands forming the boundary between Namibia, Zambia and Angola. The area surrounding the Kwando River is known for its protected game reserves, national parks and wildlife sanctuaries. It offers excellent game viewing with the perennial waters of the river attracting plentiful wildlife including large herds of elephant, hippos, crocodiles, red lechwe, turtles, zebra, impala, spotted-necked otters and over 400 species of bird. Visitors can enjoy a relaxing stay at one of the many lodges set on the banks of the river and soak up the spectacular views of wild Africa. Popular activities include: game viewing, bird watching, fishing, and camping.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Ndhovu Safari Lodge - Namushasha Lodge

Distance: 250 km

Journey: A short distance takes us through the Caprivi Strip to another river, the Kwando where we overnight. Visit a local village in this area and participate in an afternoon sunset cruise on the river.

## **Overnight: Namushasha River Lodge**

Experience this Zambezi kingdom from 25 chalets dotted along the leafy riverbank of the Kwando. Watch the vervet monkeys leap along tree branches, salute wizened elephant giants in the Bwabwata National Park and glide through wild waterways. Revel in Namushasha gold.

Location: 24 km south of Kongola on C49 (Zambezi/Kwando)

Day 13 Chobe Safari Lodge, Kasane



Tucked away in the northeastern corner of Botswana, on the banks of the famous Chobe River, the scenic little town of Kasane rests on the doorstep of the spectacular Chobe National Park. There are no boundary fences separating the village from the park and game such as elephant and hippo are often spotted roaming around the town. If on the lookout for elusive game, pay a visit to the Sedudu Valley Road, where large dead trees provide temporary homes for leopards. Within Kasane, an ancient baobab tree stands on display, once serving as a local prison. Visitors can look forward to a multitude of activities including: enjoying a game drive through the park, taking a sunset cruise down the Chobe River, visiting a local village or jumping on a day trip to the breathtaking Victoria Falls.

## **Day Itinerary**

Route: Namushasha - Chobe Safari Lodge

Distance: 260 km

Journey: The town of Katima Mulilo is our next stop before travelling south to the border with Botswana. After completing immigration and customs formalities we journey through a short section of Chobe National Park to arrive in the town of Kasane well in time for the afternoon boat cruise on the Chobe River.

## **Overnight: Chobe Safari Lodge**

Chobe Safari Lodge is situated in Kasane on the banks of the Chobe River and shares a border with Chobe National Park. Right on the doorstep is the meeting of four African countries: Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe and Zambia. Chobe Safari Lodge therefore offers an excellent getaway location to Chobe, Victoria Falls or Caprivi.

The close proximity to Victoria Falls International Airport, Livingstone International Airport and Kasane International Airport makes it easily accessible, with daily road transfers or charter flights connecting all these airports with Chobe Safari Lodge. The lodge has been recently renovated; matching a magical lodge experience to the spectacular game viewing.

Boat cruises depart from the town of Kasane at either the morning or afternoon departures. A private boat cruise can be arranged for alternate times.
